

Report on the 2017 Fundraising Campaign for the Restoration of the Mansonville Round Barn



The fundraising campaign for the restoration of the Round Barn, launched in September by the Municipality of the Township of Potton and the Potton Municipal Volunteer Group (GBMP), is a great success. As of October 19, 2017, we have raised just over \$ 40,000, which means that we have met our target. This result was made possible thanks to the generosity of 125 people and several local businesses. We even expect to exceed our goal; the Municipality is continuing to receive donations and we have a conditional pledge of \$ 10,000. Thank you to all generous donors!

The campaign expenses amount to \$ 560 for the mailing of the letter of solicitation to all citizens of Potton and the organization of the reception of October 14th, held at the Town Hall and to which about fifty people attended. This expense will be allocated to the GBMP Administration budget item and will not use the funds collected during the campaign.

The \$ 40,000 raised to date brings the balance of the Round Barn Fund to \$ 175,000. In the first half of 2018, we are awaiting the responses of Tourisme Cantons-de-l'Est and Canadian Heritage to the grant applications submitted, in time to begin the restoration work next summer as planned. It is possible that we will be lifting the barn this fall, in order to prevent it from collapsing during the winter.

The 2017 fundraising campaign would not have been so successful without the efforts of a team of enthusiastic volunteers.
