Field trip to the sites of the former and present covered bridges of Potton and North Troy. Sandra Jewett, president of the Potton Heritage Association, will tell us about the history of the bridges. Jean-Louis Bertrand, author of the booklet *The Covered Bridges of Potton*, and Hans Walser, co-director of the exhibition *The Covered Bridges of the Eastern Townships*, will inform us of the structure of covered bridges and the notable characteristics of the pont de la Frontière which is cited officially as a historical monument.
