## Inauguration of *Incomparable Potton* – a tour

Potton Heritage Association invites you to the inauguration of the driving tour of some of Potton's most historic and picturesque roads. A handsome brochure accompanies this tour of *Incomparable Potton* and we would be most delighted if you would join our inaugural calvacade, albeit by car! Our tour begins on **Thursday**, **July 25th at 10 am**. Meet at the Tourist Bureau of Potton in **Parc André-Gagnon**, **364 route de Mansonville**. After introductory remarks, coffee and scones, we will carpool. Bring your lunch, beverage and water. We'll stop to picnic en route. Be a tourist in your own Township as we wend our way over approximately 50 kilometers – rediscovering some of our most beautiful landscapes and views.

Many people have contributed time and effort to the realization of this project. A special thank-you goes to Martin Caron, a municipal employee, for his efficiency and help in the physical placement of the road signs marking the route. Our production parteners were Imprimerie CRM, who provided excellent graphics and printed the brochure; Imagerie Digitale, who designed and printed the route signs, and Paul Cyr, who designed the stylized map of the Township.

Without this substantial investment of time and money, this project would have never come to fruition. The Association invested \$7,000 of monies received from our members as well as from subsidies provided by the Municipality of the Township of Potton and the MRC de Memphrémagog. We estimate some 300 hours of volunteer time; which, if calculated at the hourly rate of a professional, would equate to a minimal additional cost of \$9,000.00

And this, without factoring in the time for discussions at the Board of Directors in choosing an appropriate name, which had to be spelled and mean the same in English and in French, be 'catchy' and aptly descriptive of the roads chosen. Just for the history books, the tour might have been named: Circuit Potton, Excursion Potton, Promenade Potton, Tour Potton, or Via Potton, none of which seemed to quite fit the bill!

In 1995 the Association began to actively promote the Township of Potton. Publications such as *Cyclo-Route Potton* (1995), *La Route des cimetières* (1995), *Mansonville Promenade du village* (1995), *Un canton à découvrir-a Township to discover* (2009), *Une promenade au village Mansonville – a village tour* (2011) witness our efforts. Our thanks go to all those who contributed to these publications.
